prosperity, and so forth) as well as the names of all the Jewish holy days and religious customs; words from everyday Jewish experience, such as *peot* (the long sidecurls customarily worn by the Chasidim); many words familiar from their use in Israel, such as *rega* (literally, "one moment," it is the Israeli equivalent of Mexico's *mañana*) or *miluim* (army reserve service); and many traditional sayings, such as *Tsarat rabim chatsi nechama* ("A public woe is half a comfort"). In addition, Glinert provides at the back of the book an alphabetical list of familiar biblical names in English, Sephardi/Israeli Hebrew, and Ashkenazi Hebrew. This celebration of Hebrew language and culture is a joy to read and to use. Everyone from Bible students to collectors of Judaica, from Woody Allen fans to people planning a journey to the Holy Land, will be delighted by this informative volume.
