U2 were Formed at a Dublin Secondary School by Adam Clayton, Bono, The Edge and Larry Mullen Jr. Like most bands, they wanted to be among the best in the

world. By 1991, with *Achtung Baby* in the pipeline and *War*, *The Unforgettable Fire* and *The Joshua Tree* behind them, they were arguably deserving of that intention. Yet there was more to the band than the stadium records that made their fans deliriously happy and the music's creators artistically and lucratively fulfilled. Their second album, *October*, opened the four piece into a spiritual journey that fed their later work. Their double album *Rattle and*
