The Question of Editing Vs. Re-composing Greenwood Publishing Group

This essay examines the three main large-scale chamber music works for strings and piano written by the Mexican composer Manuel M. Ponce: the Romantic Trio for violin, cello and piano (1912), the Sonata for violoncello and piano (1922), and the Sonata Breve for violin and piano (1930). The purpose of the study is to aid chamber music performers in the understanding, preparation and execution of these works. Written contextually for performing musicians, the format for the study of the individual works includes sections on historical background and commentary on analysis and performance considerations. In addition, each work exemplifies a different musical stage in Ponce's compositional development. The author traces the composer's compositional and stylistic evolution throughout the study of these works. The essay also includes a comprehensive biography of Ponce and a general overview of the composer's chamber music works.

A composer, pianist, and music educator, Manuel María Ponce (1882-1948) put Mexico on the musical map in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. Andres Segovia wrote to Ponce in a letter in December 1929, "to sum up, your work is what has the most value for me and for all musicians who hear it."1. Manuel María Ponce, known as one of the key composers of guitar music, also composed music for almost every instrument and for nearly every variety of media and genre: prelude, fugue, mazurka, gavotte, lied, voice and orchestra, duo, trio, quartet, choir a capella, symphonic work, and concerto.2 Yet, unknown to all was that Ponce was first and foremost a pianist who composed over seven volumes of music for the piano. Examining works for piano spanning Ponces whole life, this document focuses on their origins and stylistic development. Written in two parts, Section One offers two chapters: the first contains a brief history about Mexico leading up to the Revolution of 1910, and its effects upon the socio-political atmosphere during Ponces lifetime; the second outlines Ponces biography and his search for innovative musical techniques. Section Two presents Ponces changing piano styles alongside a discussion of Ponce's compositional life, through selected piano works in four chapters. The first and second chapters discuss a young composer exploring Western compositional techniques and aspiring to bring Mexican tunes to the concert stage. The key stages of Ponces compositional life lie in the latter years of his work. The third and fourth chapters introduce important piano works that demonstrate the maturation of his compositional styles. Revealed in these works is Ponces nationalistic fervor in his use of Mexican themes integrated with Western compositional techniques. Numerous musical examples are included in the discussion of the selected works. The Appendix includes a list of all the piano works in each compositional stage as well as a list of known recordings and their catalogue numbers. Sounds of the Modern Nation explores the development of modernist and avant-garde art music styles and aesthetics in Mexico in relation to the social and cultural changes that affected the country after the 1910-1920 revolution. Alejandro Madrid argues that these modernist works provide insight into the construction of individual and collective identities based on new ideas about modernity and nationality. Instead of depicting a dichotomy between modernity and nationalism, Madrid reflects on the multiple intersections between these two ideas and the dialogic ways through which these notions acquired meaning. Madrid challenges the view that Latin American modernist music and other art were mere imitations of European trends, advancing instead the argument that Latin American artists re-signified European ideas according to their specific historical and cultural circumstances. His work shows how microtonal and futurist music, modernist and avant-garde aesthetics, as well as indigenist and indianist ideas, entered a process of negotiation that ultimately shaped the ideological framework of twentieth-century Mexico. An Analytical Survey of Manuel M. Ponce's Sonatina Meridional in D Major

Multithreading, or applying different analytical tools to a piece or work concurrently in order to produce an ultimate deduction. In this presentation, the author analyzes Manuel Ponce's Variations sur "Folia de España" et Fugue, a sophisticated amalgamation of German counterpoint and French harmony, infused with Spanish music. Utilizing analytical tools such as Sonata theory, Schenkerian analysis, and Hermeneutic discourse, this analysis provides insight into the ways multithreading can produce a holistic analysis without being too broad or narrow. The author first applies a narrative to Ponce's work, and proposes that its various tonal areas and orchestration are in dialogue with sonata form. The author then uses Schenkerian graphs to support this hypothesis by mapping out the piece's harmonic landscape and identifying correlations between thematic areas at the deep middleground level. An underlying narrative regarding D minor's role in the struggle between fate and free will in the piece is discussed.
