Translation—the author's own translation of the biblical text, reflecting the end result of exegesis and attending to Hebrew and Greek idiomatic usage of words, phrases, and tenses, yet in reasonably good English. Notes—the author's notes to the translation that address any textual variants, grammatical forms, syntactical constructions, basic meanings of words, and problems of translation.

The early twentieth century witnessed the rise of middle-class mass periodicals that, while offering readers congenial material, also conveyed new depictions of manliness, liberal education, and the image of business leaders. "Should Your Boy Go to College?" asked one magazine story; and for over two decades these middle-class magazines answered, in numerous permutations, with a collective "yes!" In the course of interpreting these themes they reshaped the vision of a college education, and created the ideal of a college-educated businessman. Volume 24 of the *Perspectives on the History of Higher Education: 2005* provides historical studies touching on contemporary concerns--gender, high-ability students, academic freedom, and, in the case of the Barnes Foundation, the authority of donor intent. Daniel Clark discusses the nuanced changes that occurred to

the image of college at the turn of the century. Michael David Cohen offers an important corrective to stereotypes about gender relations in nineteenth-century coeducational colleges. Jane Robbins traces how the young National Research Council embraced the cause of how to identify and encourage superior students as a vehicle for incorporating wartime advances in psychological testing. Susan R. Richardson considers the long Texas tradition of political interference in university affairs. Finally, Edward Epstein and Marybeth Gasman shed historical light on the recent controversy surrounding the Barnes Foundation. The volume also contains brief descriptions of twenty recent doctoral dissertations in the history of higher education. Ana dili Arapça olmayanlara Arapça öğretimiyle ilgili yöntem arayışlarına cevap niteliğinde yeni bir akademik çalışma. Editörlüğünü Dr. Hany Ismail Ramadan'ın yaptığı esere 13 akademisyen katkıda bulunuyor. Eserde yer alan 12 bilimsel makale ile araştırmacılar, Arapça öğretiminde üç farklı düzeyde (ses-kelime ve cümle düzeylerinde) karşılaşılan sorunları ele alarak, "bunların çözümü adına standartlar oluşturulabilir miyiz?" sorusunun cevabını arıyor. Kitaptaki makaleler üç bölüme ayrılıyor: Birinci bölümde ses öğretimi, ikinci bölümde kelime öğretimi ve üçüncü bölümde ise cümle düzeyinde

karşılaşılan sorunlar ve çözüm önerileri yer alıyor. Arapça dışındaki dilleri ana dili olarak konuşanlara eğitim verdiği için dil öğretiminde yaşanan zorlukları bizzat yaşayan ve bunları çözmeye çalışan hocalar ile dil bilimi araştırmaları vesilesiyle dil öğretimi alanında yaşanan problemlere dair cevapları olan, farklı tecrübelere sahip kalemler bu kitapta buluşuyor.

TO THE FIRST ENGLISH EDITION. In preparing this translation, I have taken the liberty of including footnotes in the main text or inserting them in small type at the appropriate places. I have also corrected minor misprints without special mention ..

The Chapters and Sections of the original text have been called Parts and Chapters respectively, where the latter have been numbered consecutively. The subject index was not contained in the Russian original and the authors' index represents an extension of the original list of references. In this way the reader should be able to find quickly the pages on which anyone reference is discussed.

The transliteration problem has been overcome by printing the names of Russian authors and journals also in Russian type. While preparing this translation in the first place for my own information, the knowledge that it would also become accessible to a large circle of readers has made the effort doubly worthwhile. I feel sure that the reader will share with me in my admiration for the simplicity and lucidity of presentation.
