The Big Four Hoffmann und Campe

The Secret of Chimneys is a work of detective fiction by British writer Agatha Christie, first published in the UK by The Bodley Head in June 1925 and in the US by Dodd, Mead and Company later in the same year. It introduces the characters of Superintendent Battle and Lady Eileen Bundle and nbsp;Brent. The UK edition retailed at seven shillings and sixpence (7/6) and the US edition at \$2.00. At the request of George Lomax, Lord Caterham reluctantly agrees to host a weekend party at his home, Chimneys. A murder occurs in the house, beginning a week of fast-paced events with police among the guests. The novel was well received at first publication, described as more than a murder mystery, as it is a treasure hunt. Later reviews found it a first-class romp and one of the author's best early thrillers. The most recent review says the novel requires a hefty suspension of disbelief. The later reviewers note that descriptions of characters use the terminology of the times in which it was written, and might be considered racist decades later.

Thirteen at Dinner DigiCat

Do you want to snuggle in with a good mystery book? Agatha Christie's *The Murder on the Links* is one of the best mystery

books in history. It is a detective novel, written by British author Agatha Christie and published in 1923. It is the second book in a series of Hercule Poirot novels. The story takes place in northern France, where Detective Hercule Poirot and Captain Hastings travel per the request of one Paul Renauld. Upon their arrival, they discover that Mr. Renauld has been murdered in cold blood with a letter opener. The head of the investigation resents Poirot's involvement and proves to be outrightly hostile, but Poirot's adept detective skills prove to be a formidable asset in solving the mystery. Meanwhile, the novel is especially memorable for the subplot in which Hastings falls in love and is dispatched to a life of wedded bliss. This beautiful reprint of the original story is unabridged and unedited, preserving the first edition of *The Murder on the Links* for your reading pleasure. It is one of the best murder mystery books or crime mystery novels in history. It makes a wonderful gift for the detective fiction fan in your life or a wonderful addition to your library of classic literature. Enjoy!
