Flannery O'Connor, the renowned short-story writer, lived and fought a tumultuous battle with lupus erythematosus most of her adult life. In her last five years, she sought insightful and helpful sources to alleviate her struggle with the disease. Among these sources were the ideas and thoughts of a Jesuit-paleontologist-mystic by the name of Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, an individual who opened doors of witness to the secular world and attracted suspicious questioning from his Catholic superiors. This piece was first performed at the Walker Arts Center in Minneapolis and the at the Kitchen in New York in 1990. Mel Gussow, writing in the New York Times, observed that the language of the play was complex, moving "backwards, forward and sideways", but "what holds the audience's attention is the ingenious style of presentation. While we are still trying to correlate the barrage of words and the live video figures, some of whom appear to be taking to themselves, the rear wall suddenly swings to a perpendicular, revealing an entirely different audience sitting on bleachers on the opposite side of the stage. The

examination of the symbolism in "ETRMC", by uncovering its allegorical messages, appears to me to be of considerable interest in order to outline some traditional Gothic motifs which have been included in the story and which unleash its Gothic character. The analysis will be structured, as follows: first I will define O'Connor's conception of literary symbolism, second I will proceed by investigating the symbols corresponding to the motifs of the discomfiting ambiance in the story and at last I will concentrate on the motif of the alter-ego and its symbols.

In this absorbing study—the first comprehensive exploration of the rhetoric of the novel—Zahava Karl McKeon investigates the complex interrelations of critical poetics, grammars, dialectics, and rhetorics to devise a systematic means of dealing with the structure of prose works as communicative objects. Using the vocabulary and conceptual resources of Aristotle and Cicero, she pursues this exploration to discover the kinds of arguments that characterize novels, to find a way of distinguishing novels from other discursive wholes, and to discriminate different genres of the novel. McKeon's arguments are supplemented by readings of a variety of texts, including the novels and stories of Gunter Grass, John Fowles, Robert Coover, and Flannery O'Connor.

**Converge** Farrar, Straus and Giroux This is a reading of physical obsession in O'Connor through linguistic and literary techniques. central struggle between spirit and matter in O'Connor through a close quantitative examination of the interactions of grammatical voice and

physical bodies in her texts. Bridging literary theory and linguistics, Hardy demonstrates that the many constructions in which the body parts of O'Connor's characters are foregrounded, either as subjects or objects, are grammatical manipulations of semantic variations on what linguists deem the middle voice - roughly indicating that the subject is acting upon himself or herself. productive approach to understanding O'Connor's use of the body and its parts in her explorations of the sacramental and the grotesque. Linguistic analysis of grammatical middle voice is coupled with quantitative analysis of body-part words and the collocations in which they appear to present a new point of entrance to understanding O'Connor's stylistic manipulations of the body as central to the rift between spirit and matter. Through this method of reading O'Connor, Hardy makes a valuable contribution to the growing body of work that is introducing linguistic terminology and concepts into literary studies.

In fast allen ihrer Geschichten greift sie typische Klischees des amerikanischen Südens auf und verarbeitet diese in sozialkritischer Weise. Flannery O'Connor beruft sich auf ihre Stellung als christliche Autorin, indem sie die Vermittlung von Botschaften durch religiöse Andeutungen zum Ziel ihrer Kurzgeschichten macht. Die Groteske ihres Erzählstils erweist sich bei näherer Betrachtung nur als oberflächliche Hülle, der eine tiefer gehende Bedeutung zugrunde liegt. Auch der absichtlich flache und einfache Stil, der sich zum großen Teil als ironisch erweist, bringt dem Leser die Botschaft noch leichter nahe. Den Geschichten O'Connors fehlt die versöhnende Auflösung am Ende, stattdessen schließen sie mit erschreckenden Bildern wie Horror, Tod oder anderen Schockerlebnissen. Doch genau dadurch soll O'Connor zufolge die

Erlösung ihrer Charaktere herbeigeführt werden, die im Moment ihres Todes ein Gefühl der Würde erleben dürfen, ohne das ihr weiteres Leben ohnehin nicht lebenswert und völlig sinnlos gewesen wäre. Trotz der zahlreichen Horrorvisionen enthüllt O'Connor unweigerlich eine Komik, die dem Leser das Lachen jedoch zum Teil im Hals stecken bleiben lässt. O'Connor erzählt von einer aus den Fugen geratenen Welt, in welcher der leere Glaube an die konventionelle Ordnung eine große Rolle spielt. Doch gerade die Notwendigkeit der Zerstörung dieser Ordnung und der Hinwendung zu einem „level of mystery“, einem tiefgehenden, alles andere als oberflächlichen System, das von göttlicher Macht herrührt, ist die zentrale Botschaft ihrer Short Stories. Der Glaube der Charaktere wird mit Hilfe von Schockerlebnissen durch Außenseiter und ihre Einstellung auf die Probe gestellt und führt schließlich zu einer tieferen Erkenntnis. Besonders in *A good man is hard to find* und *The life you save may be your own* offenbart sich die Ungerechtigkeit der Welt, die Grausamkeit der Menschheit und die Borniertheit und Intoleranz konservativer Südstaatler. O'Connor kritisiert zudem die gleichgültige Einstellung der Menschen, die nur auf ihren eigenen Nutzen ausgerichtet sind und ihre meist materialistischen Absichten ohne Rücksicht auf Verluste durchzusetzen versuchen. Diese Arbeit setzt sich zum Ziel, eine Interpretation der oben genannten Kurzgeschichten Flannery O'Connors bei gleichzeitigem Vergleich der beiden Werke zu liefern. [...]

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
