Because of their power, words and the uses to which we put them, warrant the scrutiny they are given in Wordscapes. Not one of the books currently on the market encompasses the variety of content contained in Wordscapes. Other books focus on a specific aspect of words, a single ingredient in the linguistic salmagundi. There are books about euphemisms, slang, etymologies, or clichés; there are books that focus on eggcorns, snowclones, or mondegreens; there are books exploring eponyms, contronyms, retronyms, or bacronyms; and there are books about fadspeak, sportspeak, buzzspeak, or doublespeak. Nobel Prize winner Elfriede Jelinek is known as a writer who works in response to contemporary crises and cultural phenomena. Perhaps none of her works display that quality as clearly as *On the Royal Road*. Three weeks after Donald Trump's election, Jelinek mailed her German editor the first draft of this monologue, which turns out to be a stunningly prescient response to Trump and what he represents. In this drama we discover that a 'king', blinded by himself, who has made a fortune with real estate, golf courses and casinos, suddenly rules the United States, and the rest of the people of the world rub their eyes in disbelief until no one sees anything anymore. *On the Royal Road* brings into focus the phenomenon of right-wing populism. Carefully perched somewhere between tragedy and grotesque, high-pitched and squeamish, Jelinek in this work questions her own position and forms of resistance. Boethius' bekanntestes Werk ist der "Trost der Philosophie", (oder "Tröstungen der Philosophie"), das er während seiner Gefangenschaft schrieb - "das bei weitem interessanteste Beispiel von Gefängnisliteratur,

das die Welt je gesehen hat." Es ist ein Dialog zwischen der Philosophie und Boethius, in dem die Königin der Wissenschaften versucht, den gefallenen Staatsmann zu trösten. Das Hauptargument des Diskurses ist die Vergänglichkeit und Unwirklichkeit aller irdischen Größe und das höhere Begehren nach den Dingen des Geistes. Es gibt offensichtliche Spuren des Einflusses der Neuplatoniker, besonders von Proklos, und wenig, das christliche Einflüsse widerspiegelt. Der Rückgriff auf den Stoizismus, insbesondere auf die Lehren von Seneca, war angesichts der Natur des Themas unvermeidlich. Es erstaunt den modernen Leser, obwohl es den mittelalterlichen Studenten seltsamerweise nicht überraschte, dass Boethius, ein Christ und, wie jeder im Mittelalter glaubte, ein Märtyrer, es versäumt haben sollte, sich in seinem Moment der Prüfung und der mentalen Erschöpfung auf die offensichtlichen christlichen Quellen des Trostes zu beziehen. Vielleicht verstand der mittelalterliche Schüler des Boethius besser als wir, dass ein streng

formaler Dialog über den Trost der Philosophie sich strikt an den Bereich der "natürlichen Wahrheit" halten und die aus den moralischen Maximen des Christentums abzuleitende Lehre - die "übernatürliche Wahrheit" - außer Acht lassen sollte.

Al-Farabi (870-950) war einer der bedeutendsten arabischen Philosophen, der sich um die Vermittlung der islamischen Philosophie mit dem Denken der griechischen Antike besondere Verdienste erwarb. Seine Schrift »Über die Wissenschaften« erlangte durch die Übersetzung von Gerhard von Cremona eine nachhaltige Rezeption in der Philosophie des lateinischen Mittelalters. Denn in dieser Schrift beschreibt und bewertet Al-Farabi alle zu seiner Zeit bekannten Wissenschaften, erörtert sie in ihren Funktionen und Untergliederungen und setzt sie zueinander in Beziehung. Die eigentliche Bedeutung dieser Schrift liegt jedoch darin, den Erkenntnissen der beschriebenen Wissenschaften ihr eigenes Recht gegenüber den überlieferten Lehren

der Religion zuzuschreiben und das Verhältnis zwischen Glauben und Wissen neu zu bestimmen. Die Ausgabe bietet erstmals eine deutsche Übersetzung dieses Schlüsseltextes für die Einteilung und Bewertung der Wissenschaften nach der lateinischen Übersetzung von Gerhard von Cremona (1114–1187). Beigefügt ist eine kritische Edition des lateinischen Textes, der mit den überlieferten Handschriften des arabischen Originals abgeglichen wurde. Die Ausgabe erfüllt damit sowohl ein Desiderat für die Erforschung der Philosophie des Mittelalters als auch für die Erforschung der frühen Entwicklungsstufen der islamischen Philosophie. Eine ausführliche Einleitung und umfassende Sacherläuterungen geben Hilfen zur Erschließung des Textes.
