Murder Along the Cape Fear is the story of Fayetteville and Fort Bragg, North Carolina, during the twentieth century. Seen through the eyes of a native son, this is the tale of one - a distinguished historian - who lived through some of it and heard about much of it from friends and relatives. In this hundred-year journey the town was profoundly impacted by the establishment of Fort Bragg 10 miles to its west. Throughout this hundred-year history, murder seems to be the scarlet thread that stitched the town into infamy. The book demonstrates that Fayetteville was by no means innocent prior to the coming of Fort Bragg. Nor did all of the crime and evil emanate from Fort Bragg after 1918. As for murder, there was an abundance of killing that had no connection with Fort Bragg, but the most sensational murder case of the century involved Jeffrey MacDonald, a Green Beret Army captain and physician who received three life terms in federal prison for killing his pregnant wife and two daughters. While many other Fort Bragg soldiers were involved with murders along the Cape Fear, murders were also committed by transient civilians and local citizens like the famous inventor of the M-1 carbine, Marshall "Carbine" Williams, and Velma Barfield, who poisoned her mother and three other people. In all, about two dozen murder cases—some highly publicized and some not—are woven into this story about a North Carolina town in the twentieth century. Engagingly told, this book is a wonderful blend of history, lore, and murder.

Thirty four years ago a murder occurred in Fort Bragg, North Carolina. The pregnant wife and two small daughters of Green Beret Captain Dr. Jeffrey MacDonald were murdered in their home. MacDonald reported that intruders had entered his house attacking him and murdering his family. The army investigated which led to him being the suspect and an Article 32 hearing was convened. The result was lack of evidence for a court martial. He applied for a hardship release and was given an honorable discharge. The CID continued to reinvestigate him for another 2 years finally submitting their finding to the Department Of Justice with recommendations to indict him for the murder of his family. It would take nine and half years to bring him to trial, but Colette's family along with those who worked the case never gave up and when one thing failed it only gave them strength and courage to try something else. A bestseller book followed by an Emmy winning TV movie and reams of retelling the murder saga of Jeffrey MacDonald bring true crime aficionados no closer to a mind convincing verdict as to who killed his family - wife Colette and young daughters Kimberly and Kristen but this rendition of the crime forces the read to make a final choice. Jeffrey MacDonald remains in a federal prison convicted of the 1970 murders by a federal jury in 1979. Having peppered the appeals courts and indeed the Supreme Court more times than any other convicted murder in the country's history with all appeals being denied. This story will take you back to the murder scene and is full of personal on the scene investigating done honestly and with an absence of malice and provides a new look into the evidence and the investigation and prosecution of MacDonald that his followers may find some glee in but alas no fodder for another appeal. It covers the evidence presented as well as the evidence that was not. In the end the reader decides in their own jury room where guilt truly lies and if justice was served regardless of the tortuous route taken to get him convicted. A "must read" for true crime aficionados.
