The purpose of this study was to examine the effects of pre-reading strategies upon the reading comprehension for four 11th grade and one 10th grade special education students at Prairie edge school in the College Community School District.

Participants learned a total of six strategies: Talk-Aloud, Picture Flash Cards, K-W-L chart, Tea Party, Anticipation Guide, and Probable Passage. The strategies will be

used before reading information from a United States History textbook. Data was collected over an 8-week timeframe. A pre- and post-test reading probe was given at the 11th grade level and at the student instructional level. The students were given at a questionnaire at the beginning and end of the study in which the students answered questions dealing with their general attitude toward reading. The students were given 4 chapter tests during the study. Findings substantiated that through learning pre-reading strategies, students were able to demonstrate a positive impact upon their comprehension results.

To examine the effects of a Web-based English reading instruction program on pre-cadets' reading comprehension ability and their use of reading strategies. The participants were pre-

cadets at the Armed Forces Academies Preparatory School. The Paired samples t-test was applied to investigate the differences between the mean scores from the pre and post reading comprehension tests and the survey of reading strategies. The results of the analyses revealed that (1) there was a significant difference between the mean scores from the pre and post reading comprehension test at the significant level of .05 and (2) there was a significant difference between the mean scores from the pre and post survey of reading strategies at the significant level of .05. Pre-cadets improved their reading comprehension ability and their use of reading strategies after receiving a Web-based English reading instruction program.
