caratterizzano - modello teorico di riferimento, revisione della prova sulla base del try-out realizzato su un campione della popolazione di riferimento, modalità di somministrazione accurate ed omogenee, qualità metrologiche dei quesiti e della prova - consentono agli utilizzatori di poter disporre di elementi utili all'analisi e all'interpretazione dei risultati relativi agli studenti di una o più classi di «terza media». Insieme ad altre prove pubblicate in questa collana, si pone come possibile sostegno sia concettuale sia operativo al lavoro degli insegnanti in classe per far acquisire a tutti gli studenti la capacità di «comprendere» i testi scritti e quindi offrire loro strumenti per interpretare la realtà in cui vivono. Reading comprehension is a key skill given the complexity of learning society. In the international context, organizations such as the OECD and IEA collect information on the reading skills of the students; similarly, in the Italian context, INValSI prepares and distributes surveys at different times of schooling. However, it is important to acknowledge the flanking role that teachers themselves can play, not only in order to report and define reference standards, but also to improve students' skills, according to equity. This book, the third of the series entitled Reading comprehension standardized tests for the middle school, proposes a standardized test of reading comprehension for students at the end of middle school. The clarification of distinguishing procedures - a reference theoretical model, test review based on the try-out test conducted on a target population sample, accurate and homogeneous methods of administration, metrological characteristics of questions and test - enable users to have useful tools for the analysis and interpretation of results of students from one or more classes of middle school. The volume is subdivided into four chapters; the first one is about the issue of competence in reading and comprehension. The theoretical framework is also presented, based on the main insights on reading skills from international and national surveys, whose careful consideration is mandatory while planning the present test. In the second chapter procedures for planning and constructing the test are described, as well as its process of validation. The third chapter copes with the way of administration and of answer correction, a key step to ensure consistency of procedures and, thus, comparability of results. The fourth and final chapter finally deals with the analysis and interpretation of results and refers to educational implications: procedures for raw score processing are circumstantiated, as well as the analysis of results of the anchor items and an educational use of results is highlighted.
