Purpose: The purpose of this study was to assess the effectiveness of clinical photographs in the diagnosis and treatment planning of traumatic dental injuries (TDIs). A secondary objective was to explore the perceived value of clinical photographs for TDIs as well as barriers to their acquisition. Methods: A three part survey was sent to AAPD members. For

part one, individuals were randomly assigned to Version A or Version B. Part one consisted of six case-based questions. Three questions were written description only and three questions had clinical photographs, which were version dependent. Part two provided a complex TDI photograph and respondents selected all teeth with an injury. Part three consisted of ix opinion questions pertaining to TDI photographs. Results: Total of 496 respondents. Overall, there was no significance in diagnosis between written descriptions only versus written description plus photograph. In part 2, most respondents correctly selected the injured teeth. However, 31% misdiagnosed or over-diagnosed TDIs. Most respondents

agreed photographs of TDIs aided their ability to diagnose, saves time, should be taken for legal and insurance purposes, and recommend photographs should be taken routinely. Approximately 25% of respondents cited a barrier to taking photographs. Technical difficulties, patients' cooperation, and time were the most common barriers cited. Conclusion: (1.) AAPD respondents agree there is value in taking photographs for TDIs but acknowledge practice barriers. (2.) There are practice barriers in taking photographs preventing its routine use at TDI visits. (3.) Photographs are not a replacement for an exam and radiographs, but add valuable information to TDI baseline examinations.
