The 44th volume of RAP contains articles based on work presented at the 51st annual meeting of the Phytochemical Society of North America. Overall, these seven Perspectives and Communications give a very good picture of the state of plant (bio) chemistry research in North America, which is also indicative of the state of the field worldwide.
