In 1973 at the age of 47, Hall was recognized as a 33° Mason*, prior to this, he was Raised a Master Mason on sight, November 22, 1954, indeed a rare honor. Hall delivered approximately 8,000 lectures in the United States authored over 150 books and essays, and wrote numerous articles.
