The Hunting of the Snark is a nonsense poem written by Lewis Carroll. Written from 1874 to 1876, the poem borrows the setting, some creatures, and eight portmanteau words from Carroll's earlier poem "Jabberwocky" in his children's novel Through the Looking Glass. The plot follows a crew of ten trying to hunt the Snark, an animal which may turn out to be a highly dangerous Boojum; the

only one of the crew to find the Snark quickly vanishes, leading the narrator to explain that it was a Boojum after all. Henry Holiday illustrated the poem, and the poem is dedicated to Gertrude Chataway, whom Carroll met as a young girl at the English seaside town Sandown in the Isle of Wight in 1875. the preferential verse of the book); Alice Pleasance Liddell (10 years old, born in 1852, "Secunda" in the prefectural verse); Edith Mary Liddell (8 years old, born in 1853, "Tertia" in the prefectural verse). The trip started at Folly Bridge in Oxford and ended 5 km northwest of the village of Godstow. During the trip, Dodgson told the girls a story featuring Alice, a bored little girl who is looking for an adventure. The girls loved it, and Alice Liddell asked Dodgson to write it for her. He began writing the manuscript of the story the next day, although this first version no longer exists. The girls and Dodgson made another boat trip a month later when he drew the plot to the story from Alice, and in November he began working on the manuscript seriously. To add the finishing touch, he

studied natural history for the animals featured in the book, and had the book examined by other children, particularly George MacDonald's children. It was also MacDonald and Henry Kingsley who encouraged him to publish the story. Carroll added his own illustrations but approached John Tenniel to illustrate the book for publication, telling him that the story had been well loved by the children. On November 26, 1864, he gave Alice the manuscript manuscript of Alice's Underground Adventures, with illustrations by Dodgson himself, dedicating it as "a Christmas gift to a beloved child in memory of a summer's day." ". Some, including Martin Gardner, assume that there was an earlier version that was later destroyed by Dodgson when he wrote a more elaborate copy by

hand. But before Alice received her copy, Dodgson was already preparing for the publication and expanded the original from 15,500 words to 27,500 words including the episodes on the Cheshire Cat and the Mad Tea Party. LEWIS CARROLL Charles Lutwidge Dodgson (January 1, 1832 - January 14, 1898), better known by his pen name Lewis Carroll, was an English writer, mathematician, logician, Anglican deacon and photographer.
