When photographing people, you can have a great composition, perfect light, and the right camera settings, but if your subject doesn’t look right—if

the pose is off—the shot will not be a keeper. Posing is truly a crucial skill that photographers need to have in order to create great photographs. If you’re looking to improve your ability to pose your subjects—whether they’re men, women, couples, or groups—best-selling author and photographer Lindsay Adler’s *The Photographer’s Guide to Posing: Techniques to Flatter Everyone* is the perfect resource for you.
