Husserl and Spatiality is an exploration of the phenomenology of space and embodiment, based on the work of Edmund Husserl. Little known in architecture, Husserl's phenomenology of embodied spatiality established the foundations for the works

of later phenomenologists, including Maurice Merleau-Ponty's well-known phenomenology of perception.
