 The Goldberg Variations, BWV 988, is a set of variations for harpsichord by Johann Sebastian Bach (1675 - 1750). The Goldberg Variations were first published in 1741.

According to Bach's first biographer, Johann Nikolaus Forkel, the Goldberg Variations were allegedly composed to help the Russian ambassador to Saxony, Count Hermann Karl von Keyserling, with his insomnia. The variations name come from their original performer, Johann Gottlieb Goldberg, who was the Count's favourite harpsichordist.

Deal Hal Leonard Corporation This Practical Performing Edition is a well-rounded introduction to Chopin's easiest piano pieces. It contains the familiar "Prelude in A Major," "Prelude in B minor" and "Prelude in E minor," three waltzes (published posthumously), six

mazurkas and additional works. Ornaments are realized and fingering and pedal suggestions are provided. Biographical information and a brief discussion of each work further assist students with Chopin's style. Included is an outstanding CD recording from the Naxos label by internationally renowned artist Idil Biret. Canadian recording artist and piano professor Valery Lloyd-Watts also performs some of the selections.

Piano Concerto No. 3 in Solo Version ArchiteG, Inc.

Inspired by the painting by the Swiss artist Arnold Böcklin, Rachmaninoff composed his symphonic poem in the spring of 1909,

completing it while on tour in Dresden just two weeks before the premiere - given in Moscow on 1 May 1909 with the composer conducting the Moscow Philharmonic. The score reproduced here is an authoritative Soviet score issued some time after the composer's death. Unlike so many of the on-demand scores now available, this one comes with all the pages and the images have been thoroughly checked to make sure it is readable. Sergei Rachmaninoff was the solo pianist for the world premiere of his third concerto, renowned as one of the most challenging in the entire piano repertoire, in New York on November 28, 1909 with the New York Symphony conducted by Walter Damrosch. The score reproduced here is an authoritative

Piano Sonata No. 2, Op. 36 University of Chicago Press

The six "Musical Moments" Opus 16 are a set of separate solo works for piano composed by Rachmaninoff in 1896.

They present forms characteristic of previous musical eras, such as nocturne, song without words, barcarolle, etude, and theme and variations.
