Without this understanding the reader moves through a maze of obscurity. Often, too, the meaning of passages of Scripture can only be determined by

comparison with other passages. Hence, in order to a clear view of the meaning of the sacred record, not only is there need of the aid of translation, but of a library of Bible Dictionaries, Sacred Geographies, Concordances, etc., unless the result of study of these latter works is condensed in brief explanatory notes on all difficult passages.
