Salva Dut's story begins in 1980s and continues into the 2000s, and Nya's story covers the time period between 2008 and 2009. Nya belongs to the Nuer tribe. Nya lives in a remote village with her family. It is her duty to walk to the pond twice a day to fetch water for her family. She must take a very long walk twice a day in the scorching heat to fetch water from the pond, since water is quite scarce in that area. She wants to go to school like other children, but only boys are sent to the school. Nya remains worried about her sister, Akeer. Owing to the contaminated water, Akeer falls sick. Nya can't do anything for her sister.....
